We have today placed two slick line plugs (physical barriers) in the Montara H1 well, in addition to the cement plug and the 1.3 sg brine. The West triton is P&A relief well and expected to demobilise from site back to Singapore region on Friday / Saturday. We therefore are of the opinion that the oil response spreads can be stood down asap subject to AMSA's decision.

The support vessel Nor Captain) will return to Darwin to demobilise the deluge equipment and crew change, returning to the field next week to carry out a pressure test against the second plug installed today.. We will discuss with AMOSC retaining boom / skimmer equipment in Darwin for a period.

Discussions are ongoing with the rig owner regarding options to remove the rig.

Further updates will be issue as required by progress.
